



Digital Skills Guide

It's estimated that from 2020 90% of jobs will require digital skills, yet in the UK there are over 11 million people who lack basic digital skills, including over 5 million workers.

This guide will help you deliver digital learning in the workplace to help people build their digital skills and signpost members to additional online learning opportunities.

Running digital learning activity - tips

If you're working with members who have low levels of digital skills or digital confidence, remember that email and other digital communications often isn't the most effective way to reach them. UNISON have produced a range of [learning surveys](#) that focus on different digital skills you can print off and use when finding out what members would like to learn.

For some digital learning activity such as group workshops you might need to access a learning centre or training room with computers and WiFi access. Always check that if you are using workplace equipment, the sites you need to use aren't blocked by your employer before running a workshop.

Some people will prefer to carry out digital learning on their own devices and in their own time. To support learners with limited access to devices or WiFi, you can use Kickstart or Moving On funding to purchase tablets, laptops and other digital resources to use in your branches.

Digital Champions

UNISON Digital Champions are trained volunteers who can support colleagues learn new digital skills, gain digital confidence and overcome barriers to getting digitally active in the workplace.

Digital Champions could show someone how to book leave on the staff intranet and other digital tasks lots of us take for granted. When incorporated with the Union Learning Rep role, Digital Champions could deliver short digital learning courses and drop-ins for colleagues to help people develop their digital skills.
