



Courses for UNISON representatives and branch officers

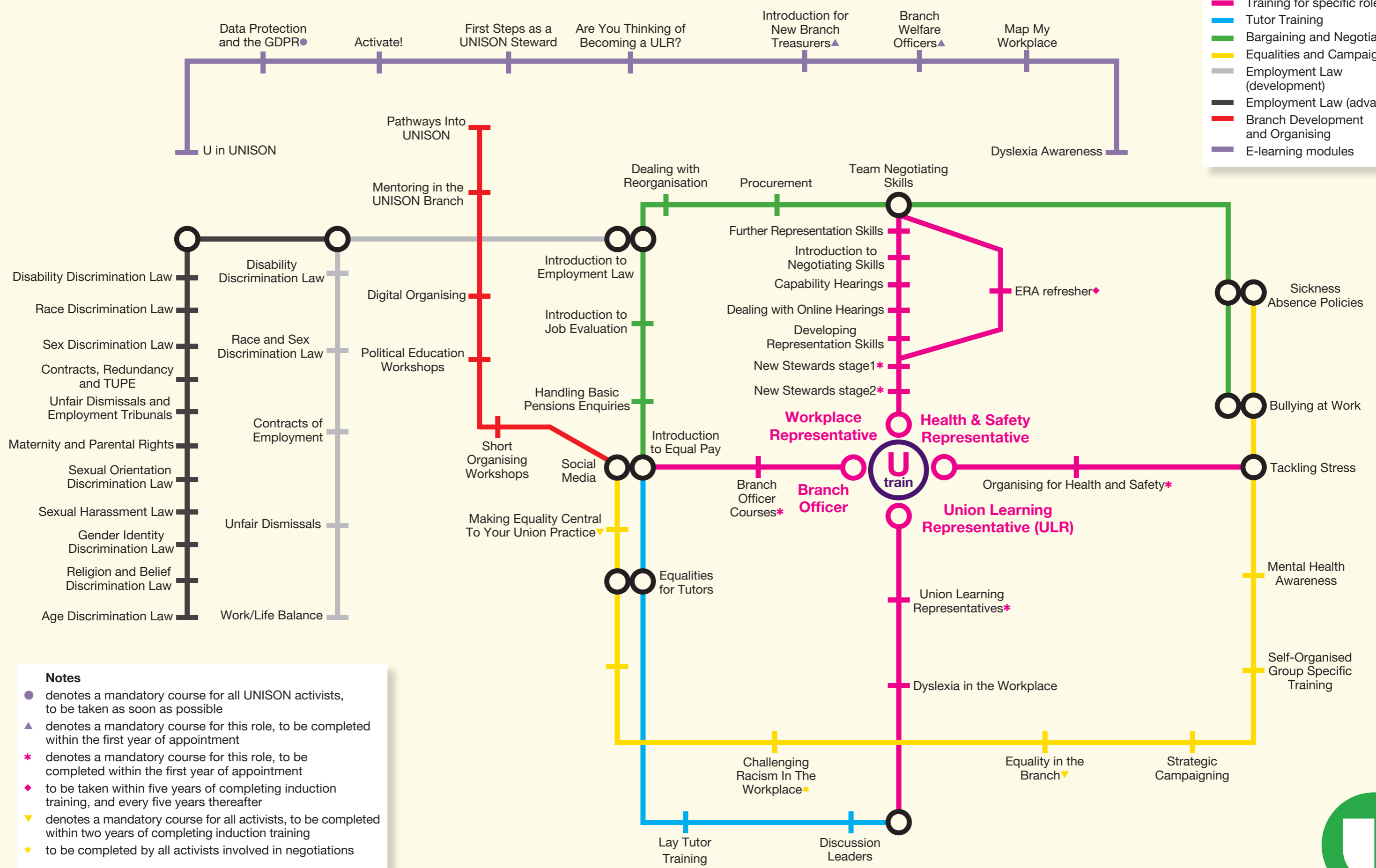
UNISON training is designed to give you the skills you need to carry out your role, and all courses are free to the UNISON member, although there may be a charge to your branch. You should start at the centre of the map (overleaf) with the induction training indicated for your role. After that, you can progress through the development training according to your interests and the branch's needs. Discuss further optional courses and pathways with your branch education co-ordinator or union learning rep.
